

THE GOLDA W. SHULMAN SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Introduction

Golda W. Shulman lived in the Vandalia community from 1941 until her death in 2000. She was a leader in town and a fervent believer in the value of education. She was the first female school board member in Vandalia and served on the Board for many years. She contributed to many charities in the area, giving generously of her time, energy, and resources. She was dedicated to her family and respectful and tolerant of other people's opinions, backgrounds, and beliefs provided that they were free of prejudice or intolerance. Mrs. Shulman also appreciated spirit and feistiness and was not afraid to speak her mind. She particularly appreciated seeing people exceeding the expectations others set for them and making the most of their opportunities.

Mrs. Shulman's family (Maurice, her husband of 59 years, and their children VCHS classes of 1961, '65, '67, '69, '76) established this scholarship to honor her memory by helping students who embody the qualities she admired. The best grades and popularity were less important to Mrs. Shulman than kindness, doing one's best, giving back to the community, and dedication to family. It is hoped that the winners of this scholarship will, in turn, honor her memory.

THE GOLDA W. SHULMAN SCHOLARSHIP FUND APPLICATION

In order to be considered for this \$2,000 per academic school year renewable scholarship, the applicant must:

- Be currently enrolled as a senior at Vandalia Community High School.
- Possess a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 / 4.0 scale or 3.0 / 5.0 scale (C average).
- Provide an official high school transcript with this application.
- Submit two letters of reference with this application form. (See Section II)
- Submit a one page (typed in black ink) personal essay. (See Section III)
